

# MARKET COMMENT (BASED ON THE SICAV REFERENCE CURRENCY)


In March, emerging markets faced several impactful financial and macroeconomic events. U.S. markets saw volatility with concerns over inflation and trade tensions, following the imposition of 25% tariffs on non-U.S. automobiles. The Federal Reserve's choice to hold interest rates and update the economic outlook offered some stability, though fars of a recession persisted, driven by rising U.S. Treasury yields and consumer inflation worries. Emerging markets displayed mixed equity performance. Some key indices struggled, while certain sectors and countries showed resilience amid global uncertainties. China performed well, supported by structural reforms and positive investor sentiment, whereas Taiwan faced pressures from regional tensions and economic challenges. The Uni-Global - Defensive Emerging Markets Equities portfolio returned -0.3%, underperforming the MSCI Emerging Markets TR Net benchmark return of 0.6%, resulting in a relative underperformance

Chart of volatility of the share class (since inception)\*






## Maximum loss of the share class (since inception)<sup>3</sup>








#### Breakdown by GICS sectors
